



WEEK OF THE REVELATION OF CHRIST'S MYSTERY TO JOHN THE BAPTIST

Isaiah 40: 6-11

A voice says, "Proclaim!" I answer, "What shall I proclaim?" "All flesh is grass, and all their loyalty like the flower of the field. The grass withers, the flower wilts, when the breath of the LORD blows upon it." "Yes, the people is grass! The grass withers, the flower wilts, but the word of our God stands forever." Go up onto a high mountain, Zion, herald of good news! Cry out at the top of your voice, Jerusalem, herald of good news! Cry out, do not fear! Say to the cities of Judah: Here is your God! Here comes with power the Lord GOD, who rules by his strong arm; Here is his reward with him, his recompense before him. Like a shepherd he feeds his flock; in his arms he gathers the lambs, Carrying them in his bosom, leading the ewes with care.

2 Corinthians 10:1-11 Accusation of Weakness

I myself, Paul, appeal to you by the meekness and gentleness of Christ — I who am humble when face to face with you, but bold toward you when I am away! — I ask that when I am present I need not show boldness by daring to oppose those who think we are acting according to human standards.

Indeed, we live as human beings, but we do not wage war according to human standards; for the weapons of our warfare are not merely human, but they have divine power to destroy strongholds. We destroy arguments and every proud obstacle raised up against the knowledge of God, and we take every thought captive to obey Christ. We are ready to punish every disobedience when your obedience is complete. Look at what is before your eyes. If you are confident that you belong to Christ, remind yourself of this, that just as you belong to Christ, so also do we. Now, even if I boast a little too much of our authority, which the Lord gave for building you up and not for tearing you down, I will not be ashamed of it. I do not want to seem as though I am trying to


frighten you with my letters. For they say, "His letters are weighty and strong, but his bodily presence is weak, and his speech contemptible." Let such people understand that what we say by letter when absent, we will also do when present.

John 1:29-34 John's Testimony to Jesus

The Apostles said: The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him and declared, "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me.' I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel." And John testified, "I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God."

"Behold, the Lamb of God."

John the Baptist does not draw attention to himself. He points away from himself and toward Jesus. His mission is simple: help others recognize who Jesus truly is. Today's Gospel reminds us that faith grows when we humbly witness to Christ by our words, our choices, and our love for others.

Five Inspiring Lessons from the Gospel: John 1:29–34

1. **Jesus comes toward us with mercy** John does not point to a judge, but to “the Lamb of God.” Christ meets us in our weakness, carries our burdens, and offers forgiveness and new beginnings.

2. A faithful life helps others find Christ

John’s greatest mission was not to be noticed, but to help others recognize Jesus. When we live our faith with humility and love, our lives quietly lead others to God.

3. God reveals Himself to listening hearts

John recognizes Jesus because he is attentive to the Spirit. When we slow down, pray, and listen, God opens our eyes to His presence in our lives.

4. Jesus comes gently, not forcefully

God does not overwhelm us. He approaches with patience and love. Often, Christ enters our lives through small moments, simple encounters, and quiet grace.

We are invited to be witnesses of hope John says, “Now I have seen and testified.” Every believer is called to share hope, mercy, and faith through daily actions and words.
