Feast of the Glorious Pentecost

Acts 2:1-21

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there ap-

peared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language. They were astounded, and in amazement they asked, "Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans? Then how does each of us hear them in his own native language? We are Parthians, Medes, and Elamites, inhabitants of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the districts of Libva near Cyrene, as well as travelers from Rome, both Jews and converts to Judaism, Cretans and Arabs, yet we hear them speaking in our own tongues of the mighty acts of God." They were all astounded and



bewildered, and said to one another, "What does this mean?" But others said, scoffing, "They have had too much new wine." Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice, and proclaimed to them, "You who are Jews, indeed all of you staying in Jerusalem. Let this be known to you, and listen to my words. These people are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: 'It will come to pass in the last days,' God says, 'that I will pour out a portion of my spirit upon all flesh. Your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your young men shall see visions, your old men shall dream dreams. Indeed, upon my servants and my handmaids I will pour out a portion of my spirit in those days, and they shall prophesy. And I will work wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below: blood, fire, and a cloud of smoke. The sun shall be turned to darkness, and the moon to blood, before the coming of the great and splendid day of the Lord, and it shall be that everyone shall be saved who calls on the name of the Lord.'

- 8. Refusing to carry out menial tasks; Seeking or wanting to be singled out;

The meaning of the <u>Feast of Pentecost</u> according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) centers on the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church.

1. The Descent of the Holy Spirit

CCC 731:

"On the day of Pentecost when the seven weeks of Easter had come to an end, Christ's Passover is fulfilled in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, manifested, given, and communicated as a divine person: of his fullness, Christ, the Lord, pours out the Spirit in abundance."

Pentecost fulfills Jesus' promise to send the Advocate (John 14:16). The Spirit comes as a gift of the Risen Christ.

2. The Birth of the Church

CCC 1076:

"Pentecost is the day of the manifestation of the Church, the day when the Church is revealed to the world in power and mission."

On Pentecost, the Church begins her public mission to the world, empowered to preach the Gospel to all nations.

3. The Holy Spirit as the Soul of the Church

CCC 797:

"What the soul is to the human body, the Holy Spirit is to the Body of Christ, which is the Church." The Holy Spirit builds, animates, and sanctifies the Church, beginning with Pentecost and continuing to this day.

4. Unity in Diversity

CCC 814:

"From the beginning, this one Church has been marked by a great diversity which comes from both the variety of God's gifts and the diversity of those who receive them."

At Pentecost, the apostles spoke in many tongues. This shows how the Spirit unites all peoples while honoring their diversity.

5. Personal Pentecost

CCC 1302–1303 (on Confirmation):

"It is evident from its celebration that the effect of the sacrament of Confirmation is the special outpouring of the Holy Spirit... more perfectly bound to the Church... enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit." Each believer receives a share in Pentecost through the sacraments, especially Confirmation, making the Spirit's mission personal.

"He breathed on them..." (John 20:22)

Imagine Jesus standing in front of his disciples after the resurrection—scarred, radiant, alive. And then He breathes on them. Not just air—but life, courage, mission. That's what Pentecost is for you and me. **Pentecost is God's breath in your lungs**. CCC 731 says that at Pentecost, Christ "pours out the Spirit in abundance."

This isn't just about history. The same Spirit who shook the upper room is still alive today, whispering to you in your doubt, nudging you when you feel stuck, igniting your faith when it feels cold. That fire? It's not gone. It's in you.

Pentecost is your invitation to rise and speak. CCC 1076 calls Pentecost the moment when the Church is revealed to the world.

So when you forgive someone who hurt you, when you stand up for what's right, when you choose love over fear—you're living Pentecost. You become part of the Church's mission to bring light into a wounded world.

You've already received your own Pentecost.

CCC 1302–1303 talks about Confirmation as a "special outpouring of the Holy Spirit."




